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MANAGEMENT PROFILE

The Hyderabad (Sind) National Collegiate Board was managing the National College in Hyderabad (Sind) long before the partition of India. The Board was associated with the National Movement for the Independence of India. After the Partition of the country in 1947, the members of Sindhi Hindu Community were compelled to abandon the college and migrate to India. Late Vidyasagar Principal K.M.Kundnani was the Principal at that time. After the partition of the country in 1947, Late Vidyasagar Principal K.M.Kundnani appreciated the need of his teaching fraternity and the community and initiated efforts for starting a college in Mumbai. He received active support and encouragement from Late Barrister Hotchand G.Advani. Both of them together founded the **Hyderabad (Sind) National Collegiate Board** in 1949 at Mumbai. Late Barrister H.G.Advani was the **Founder President** and Late Vidyasagar Principal K.M.Kundnani was the **Founder Secretary** and **Founder Principal** of the first college started by the Board and known as the Rishi Dayaram National College, Bandra, Mumbai –400050.

This was followed by a chain of Educational Institutions belonging to various faculties such as Arts, Science, Commerce, Management, Education, Law, Engineering, Technology and Para-Medical. The Institutions managed by the Board and affiliated to the University of Mumbai are as follows

HISTORY

The Institute started functioning in 1981 as a Post Graduate Diploma awarding Institute.

In 1983, the Institute was recognized for a Post B.Sc. three-year degree programme, in Technology, leading to, B.Sc.(Tech) Br. viii Degree of Mumbai University in the areas of :

- (a) Electronics Engineering (Including Industrial Electronics)**
- (b) Computer Technology (Hardware & Software)**
- (c) Electronics Instrumentation (Including Biomedical Instrumentation)**

The programme received permanent AICTE recognition in the same year.

The first batch of student graduated in 1986.

The institute is also recognized by **Institution of Engineers (India)**

The institute switched over to the 4 – year B.E. Degree Course in Engineering w. e. f. the year 2002-03 with the approval of the Government of Maharashtra, with the affiliation of University of Mumbai and with the approval of the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE).

ACADEMICS

All the departments of the institute have well equipped laboratories and have qualified and dedicated teaching staff. Every year the departments invite eminent members from industry and academics to give lectures and seminars. An advisory board comprising faculty members from IIT Mumbai guided the final year students of the Electronics and Telecommunication department in their projects.

To ensure continuous advancement, the institute encourages and sponsors faculty members to undertake higher education and research activities. As a result, many faculty members are pursuing post graduate and Doctorate programmes. The institute regularly conducts short term training programmes and workshops.

RESULTS AND RANKS

The students of Watumull have performed extremely well securing ranks at the university examination from the very first batch of the BE degree. Last year the students of Biomedical and Instrumentation departments secured ranks in the B.E. examination.

TECHNICAL ACTIVITIES

To hone the technical abilities and skills of budding engineers the institute has encouraged formation of student chapters of international technical societies and has IEEE, IETE, ISA and CSI student chapters. These student bodies actively organize numerous technical events throughout the year. The college has its own robotic society (RSW) which conducts robotic events and trains the first year students into making robots and our students have won accolades at different inter college robotic competitions.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The institute strives towards all round development of the students and in this endeavour promotes a lot of extra curricular and sports activities. The gymkhana possesses facilities for indoor games like chess, carom and table tennis. The badminton and football teams of Watumull have also won many inter college sports events. The cultural events conducted like the annual fest Ensemble provide a platform for the creatively skilled students. A literary society - LITMUS has been formed last year, where activities like poetry recitation, book reviews and discussion on various topics are organized. SWIFT- film society has been formed by interested students and provides students with an opportunity of viewing classic national and international movies.

The Alumni Association is in the process of formation. The college alumni is actively participating in multifarious activities encompassing summer training to students in the industry, conducting seminars on various topics enabling students to prepare themselves for placement, etc.

PLACEMENTS

The students of Watumull are regularly placed in various top listed organizations like Infosys, Geodesic, Iflex, Capgemini, Bluestar Infotech, Tech.Mahindra .Job shows, group discussion sessions, mock interviews and seminars by experts from the industry are organized to help students.

NOTE: 1) Admission will be made strictly in order of merit in INSTITUTE QUOTA category in accordance with the Government Resolutions for admission.

42 Seats will be filled by the college for Institute Quota on the merit basis of the MHT-CET-2010 Entrance Examination, subject to any changes introduced by the AICTE or by the University of Mumbai or the State Government or the Directorate of Technical Education. It is necessary for the candidates to have secured non zero score in MHT-CET- 2010 Entrance Examination. However in order to become eligible, the candidate should have secured a minimum of 50% marks in PCM (Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics marks added together). Applications for admission to these 42 seats of Institute Quota should be submitted directly in the college at Worli, Mumbai-400 018 on the prescribed form issued by the college along with the prospectus.

2.0 DURATION OF THE COURSE.

Bachelor of Engineering (BE) Degree Course affiliated to the University of Mumbai is of four years duration.

3.0 MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION: ENGLISH

4.0 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- Candidate should be an Indian National
- In order to secure admission to first year of four year degree courses in Engineering, the candidates should fulfill the following eligibility criteria;

4.1 Educational Qualification: Passed the HSC (Std. XII) examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination with:

- Ø Physics
- Ø Chemistry
- Ø Mathematics and
- Ø English as one of the subjects **AND**
- Secured minimum 50% marks in PCM (Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics added together.)

**4.2 Entrance Test Requirement:-
MHT-CET-2010 Candidates**

1. Educational qualification as specified in rule number 4.1
2. Appeared for the Maharashtra –Health Technical –Common Entrance Test (MHT-CET-2010) conducted by the Government of Maharashtra for the academic year 2010-11 and secured non-zero score.

4.3 Admission to BIOMEDICAL ENGINEERING COURSE:

Candidates seeking admission to Biomedical Engineering course should have passed in the subject of **Biology** in the qualifying examination in addition to the Eligibility Criteria as mentioned in Rule 4.1.

4.4 NOTE:

1. In case the maximum marks in an individual subject is other than 100 or total marks other than 300, then while converting marks out-of-100 or total out-of-300, no rounding off of the marks will be done. If the converted mark works out to be a figure with fraction, fraction up to two decimal places will only be considered. e.g. if marks obtained (after conversion) added together work out to be 149.99 out of 300 then such a candidate will not be eligible for seeking admission to Degree courses in Engineering.
2. If letter grades are assigned instead of marks at SSC, HSC or its equivalent examination the candidate must obtain the certificate of conversion of letter of grades into marks from the competent authority where from the candidate has passed the examination. The candidate should produce such certificate at the time of submission of application form.

6.0 ATTESTATION AND TRANSLATION OF DOCUMENTS:

6.1 Attestation of Documents.

The candidates shall note the following points while submitting the application forms.

- The candidates shall attach **attested copies** of all the required certificates as mentioned in these rules and enumerate the same in the given format. The candidates **shall not** attach a copy of any other certificate which is **not** asked for under these rules such as certificates for participation in sports, cultural activities etc.
- The copies of certificates or documents attached to the admission form should be attested by the Principal of College from which the candidate has passed qualifying examination or Gazetted Officer or Special Executive Magistrate or Head Master of a Secondary School or teaching staff of a Government College / Polytechnic not below the rank of a Lecturer.
Original certificates should not be attached with the application.

6.2 Translation of Documents

If the candidate produces any certificate, which is not in Marathi or Hindi or English language, authenticated Marathi or Hindi or English version of the same duly attested by a **Gazetted Officer** are also required to be produced.

7.0 ASSIGNMENT OF MERIT NUMBER

7.1 Merit Number:

Each Institute Quota candidate who has submitted application form on or before the last date prescribed for the submission of the application form will be assigned a Merit Number based on the marks in MHT-CET-2010.

Assignment of a Merit number does not indicate or ensure admission to any seat.

7.2 RELATIVE MERIT IN CASE OF TIE:

In case of candidates securing equal number of marks in MHT-CET-2010, their relative merit will be fixed on the basis of following in order of preference given below:

- a) A candidate securing higher marks out-of-100 in the subject of Mathematics in MHT-CET-2010.
- b) A candidate securing higher marks out-of-50 in the subject of Physics in MHT-CET-2010.
- c) A candidate passing S.S.C. (X Std.) Examination with higher aggregate marks .
- d) A candidate securing higher marks in the subject of Mathematics at SSC (X Std.) Examination.
- e) Birth date of the candidate (Elder candidate will be given preference).

Note for All: While converting the marks out of 100 / 150 / 600 / 750, if marks work out to be a figure with fraction, fraction upto two decimal places will only be considered.

7.3 CHANGE OF MARKS DUE TO VERIFICATION:

- If the marks in the qualifying examination are modified due to verification and the same is duly certified by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent, the same shall be reported to the **Principal** immediately.
- However, the effect of the change in marks will be taken into consideration only for the subsequent rounds of admission.

8.0 ADMISSION STEPS:

- 8.1 Step 1** 42 seats shall be offered to Institute Quota candidates in various branches as per merit inter se .
- 8.2 Step 2** **Vacant seats, if any** shall be announced (as mentioned in **15.0**) later and offered to those candidates who shall apply for the **Vacancy Round**, strictly as per merit inter se in this Vacancy Round. In the event of student /candidate withdraws before the starting of the college, the refund shall be made after deduction of the cancellation charges of Rs. 1000/- (Rupees One Thousand Only). In the event of student / candidate leaves after joining the college and if the seat consequently falling vacant has been filled by another candidate by the last date of admission, the college shall refund the fee collected, with proportionate deduction of monthly fee.

9.0 REPORTING FOR ADMISSION:

9.1 Documents Required:

No application will be considered unless it is accompanied by the attested copies of the following documents: (3 sets)

- a** **Indian Nationality:** The certificate of Indian Nationality is part of the Domicile certificate, which is usually issued by the Tahshildar/Executive Magistrate/ Dy. Collector of the concerned Taluka/District wherein the candidate ordinarily resides. In lieu of the **“Certificate of Indian Nationality”** any one of the following certificates/documents will also be acceptable-
- i) Indian Passport in the name of the candidate, issued by appropriate authorities.**
 - ii) The School Leaving Certificate indicating the Nationality of the candidate as ‘Indian’.**
- b.** Statement of Marks obtained at H.S.C./XII or its equivalent qualifying examination.
- c.** College Leaving Certificate (after qualifying examination).
- d.** Statement of marks obtained at S.S.C./X or its equivalent examination.
- e.** For candidates from the Board other than Maharashtra Board “Eligibility Certificate” is required. Admission, if granted shall remain PROVISIONAL until **“Eligibility Certificate”** is processed by the college, which is finally accepted by the University of Mumbai subsequently.
- f.** Birth Certificate showing date and Place of birth, if it is not shown on S.S.C. (Std X) passing certificate.
- g.** MHT-CET-2010 Score Card and Admit Card.

9.2 Retention of Original Certificate:

If the candidate is offered admission, his or her original College Leaving Certificate (post qualifying examination) and Statement of Marks at the qualifying examination will be retained by the College. **These two original certificates will not be returned to any candidate once admitted to a course unless the candidate cancels his or her admission or completes the entire course.**

9.3 Mode of payment of fees:

The candidate who has been offered a seat in the college shall pay the prescribed fees in the form of D.D. (Demand Draft) / pay order / Bankers Cheque of any schedule bank.

No other mode of payment shall be permitted. D.D. (Demand Draft) / pay order / Bankers Cheque should be drawn in favour of **‘PRINCIPAL, WATUMULL INSTITUTE, MUMBAI’**. The fees shall be paid by the admitted candidate during the process of admission as per the guidelines given.

10.0 FEES, CANCELLATION AND REFUND:

10.1 Fees:

Interim fee for *the* students admitted in the academic year 2010-11 will be Rs.73700/- for Institute quota. The interim fee will be subject to change as per the decision of the “Shikshan Shulka Samiti”. Decision of Shikshan Shulka Samiti will be binding on the students. If the final fee approved is less than the interim fee collected, the same shall be refunded within four weeks.

10.2 University fees:

The candidate shall be required to pay fees if any as prescribed by University from time to time.

10.3 Cancellation of Admission:

- a) The candidate should have taken admission by paying necessary tuition fee and should have submitted original certificates before he/she applies for cancellation. **In case candidate fails to submit any of the original documents within the allowed time limit (i.e. 4 working days after the date of allotment), the admission shall be treated as cancelled. Refund of fees shall not be applicable to such candidates.**
- b) If the candidate desires to cancel his or her admission for any reason whatsoever during the Admission Process, he or she shall be allowed to do so and it shall be presumed that admission is cancelled at that stage.
- c) **The candidate desirous of cancelling admission shall apply for cancellation in writing and shall also give the reason for cancellation of admission.**
- d) The candidate cancelling admission shall forfeit the candidature and no longer be considered for the admission offered by the Competent Authority during the current year and fees shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting an amount as prescribed in these rules.

10.4 ISSUE OF COLLEGE LEAVING CERTIFICATE:

- a) If during the course of studies, a candidate desires to discontinue studies for any reason whatsoever, he or she shall be allowed to do so and it shall be presumed that admission is cancelled at that stage. The Principal shall issue College Leaving Certificate and the fees shall be refunded as per the rules mentioned.
- b) If the admission is cancelled on or before 30 days from the date of admission, the original College Leaving Certificate on the strength of which a candidate was admitted shall be returned .
- c) If the admission is cancelled after 30 days from the date of admission, the Leaving Certificate from the institution where the candidate was finally admitted should be issued. A true copy of the original College Leaving Certificate retained by the institute may be issued, if requested by the candidate, duly attested by the Head of the college.

11.0 REFUND OF FEES:

The candidate who has been provisionally admitted may cancel admission by submitting an application in the college office between 11.00 A.M. to 4.00 P.M. and may request for refund of fees. The refund of fees, as applicable, shall be made in due course. It is made clear that such application for cancellation will be considered if and only if the admission is confirmed by paying the prescribed fee in full and by submitting the original documents.

Refund shall be made after deduction of the cancellation charges as shown below.:

- 1] **In the event of a student / candidate withdraws before the starting of the college, the refund shall be made after deduction of the cancellation charges of Rs. 1000/- (Rupees One Thousand Only).**
- 2] **In the event of student / candidate leaves after joining the college and if the seat consequently falling vacant has been filled by another candidate by the last date of admission, the college shall refund the fee collected, with proportionate deduction of monthly fee.**

12.0 MISCELLANEOUS :

- **The medium of instruction for degree course in Engineering and Technology is English.**
- Admission of candidate (other than those passed H.S.C. from Maharashtra Board) who has been admitted will be treated as finally confirmed only on production of the Eligibility Certificate from the University of Mumbai.
- **Physical fitness:** Head of the institution at his or her discretion may refer any candidate to the appropriate medical authority for ascertaining the physical fitness of the candidate to undergo the requirements of the course. The report of medical authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action. It is to be noted that physically handicapped candidates are not provided with any additional facilities as far as academic activities pertaining to the course are concerned.

- Head of the institute may verify the antecedents of any candidate through the appropriate police authority. The report received from police authority shall be submitted to the Regional Head of Technical Education for further necessary action.

14.0 CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE:

- 14.1 Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, if the Govt. takes any policy decision pertaining to F.E. admissions, then the same shall be brought into effect at that point of time as per the directives from the Govt. from time to time.
- 14.2 The students while studying in any college, if found indulging in anti-national activities contrary to the provisions of Acts and Laws enforced by Government or in any activity contrary to rules of discipline, will be liable to be expelled from the college without any notice by the Principal of the college.

14.3 **Action against ragging: Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act 1999** **which is in effect from 15th May 1999 has the following provisions for Action against Ragging**

- a) Ragging within or outside of any educational institution is prohibited.
- b) Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term up to 2 years and / or penalty which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- c) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for period of five years from the date of order of such dismissal.
- d) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parent or guardian or a teacher of an education institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of the institution shall, without prejudice to the forgoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into matter mentioned in the complaint and if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend student who is accused of the offence, and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situated, for further action. Where on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is found that there is no substance, prime facie, in the complaint received, he / she shall intimate the fact in writing to the complainant. The decision of the head of the institution shall be final.
- e) If the head of educational institution fails or neglects to act in the manner specified in section “d” above when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in section “b” above.

14.4 Failure of the candidate in making **full and correct Statements** in the application form and/or **suppression** of any information would **lead to disqualification** of the candidate for the entire admission procedure. Such a candidate will be debarred from the entire admission process. If already admitted, his or her admission will be cancelled, fees forfeited and he or she may be expelled from the college by the Principal.

14.5 Any issue not dealt here-in above will be dealt with, when arising, fully and finally by the Principal

14.6 UNDERTAKING :

All candidates who have applied for admission shall **be deemed to have submitted** the following undertaking :

I have read all the Rules of Admission and after understanding these rules thoroughly, I have filled-in the application form for admission for the current year.

The information given by me in my application is true to the best of my knowledge and belief. I understand that if any of the statements made by me in the application form or any information supplied by me in connection with my admission is later on at any time, found to be false or incorrect, my application will be cancelled, fees forfeited and I may be expelled from the college by the Principal.

- a) I have not been debarred from appearing at any examination held by the Government Constituted or Statutory Examination Authority in India.
- b) I fully understand that the offer of a course will be made to me depending on my inter se merit and availability of a seat at the time of scrutiny of my application, when I will actually report to the admission authority according to the schedule of admission.
- c) I understand that no document after the last date of submission will be entertained for the purpose of claims or concessions etc. in connection with my admission unless otherwise mentioned in the rules.
- d) I am fully aware that the Competent Authority or its representative will not make any correspondence with me regarding admission. I am also aware that it is entirely my responsibility to see the notice board of concerned Admission Centre.

- e) I am aware that any rule imposed by the University such as “imposing limits on the number of attempts permissible to pass any examination” shall be binding on me.
- f) I hereby agree to conform to any Rules, Acts and Laws enforced by Government and I hereby undertake that I will do nothing either inside or outside the college which may result in disciplinary action against me under these Rules, Acts, Laws referred to.
- g) I fully understand that the Principal of college, has right to expel me from the college for any infringement of the rules of the conduct and discipline prescribed by the college or University or Government and the Undertaking given above.
- h) **Condition of minimum attendance: I am fully aware that my Academic Term shall not be granted and I will not be allowed to appear for examination if I do not attend minimum 75 percent classes of theory, practical, drawing etc. (100% attendance will be appreciated) I am also aware that I will not be allowed to appear for the examination, if I fail to submit satisfactorily all the assignments, jobs, journals, drawings, reports as specified by the University within stipulated time limit.**
